**Caseworker Visits:** Caseworker visits with children are displayed in ROM in two reports: One showing a point-in-time count of completed visits, and one showing a historical percentage of completed visits for previous months. At this time, there is no ROM report that captures worker-parent visits. These percentages are calculated twice each month using FACTS report sm0809. The report is run one week prior to the end of the month, and again one week after the end of the month. Data presented in this document are based on the latter.
